Discussion:

Mike Adams:

- Read through meeting's agenda
- Training on Student Community Council coming up on Thursday, 3:30 @ district office in Spanish Fork in board room.

Keith Richards:

- Discussed detention policy. The one during lunch was not changing behavior, not very effective.
- This year, we will be handling it more in the classroom with the teachers. Teachers will contact parents after 3rd tardy that has occurred within a 2 week period.
- After 3rd tardy within a 2 week period within a single class, detention will be required.
- Detention will be handled and served with the teacher in whose class the 3 tardies occurred.

Rashel Shepherd: Sage Results from last 3 years

- Discussed how the state raised the goal after seeing that a lot of school districts met the state goals and received "A's"
- Safe results for the following subjects were discussed: language arts, math, science.
- Spoke on ESL, economically disadvantaged, and students with disabilities and their sage results in language arts, math, and science.

- *Liz Porter* spoke on PTO wanting to help out more in the classroom, specifically with the ESL, economically disadvantaged, and students with disabilities categories. She said many parents don't feel like they are being utilized.
