

School Community Council Meeting: October 20, 2020

2:06-2:10pm Meeting Begins with review of minutes from prior meeting. Edit made to the voting section of the prior meeting (Sept 18) minutes to clarify that Mrs. Snapp was nominated for chair by Mr. Bennett. Minutes then approved from the previous meeting.

2:10-2: 20pm 2020-2021 School Plan

Plan reviewed individually on paper and then discussed. Concerns over end of year data for the last 3 years due to COVID-19 not testing last year, and the testing administration issues from the year before. Since other schools have similar data issues there shouldn't be much of a consequence, but will still try to show improvement. Accreditation will also look at our School Plan as evidence of our school's reflection on problems and issues.

2:20-2:25 pm Digital Citizenship Discussion

NetSmart Internet Safety will be online this year, but the message should be the same. In prior years, students were taught digital citizenship with Fight the Drug assembly, and guest speaker Colin Karchner. Group has some disappointment that it is less exciting/interactive online compared to an assembly, but glad to still meet the digital citizenship requirements. Remember to encourage students and parents to discuss learning at home. Possible six session online program, will choose 3 of the six to meet student needs here at Mapleton.

2:25-2:35pm Student Wellness Discussion

District already has a teacher wellness program helping encourage them to exercise and get wellness checks. How do we help students meet their wellness goals? Vending machines and cafeteria meet nutritional goals and requirements. Administration is trying to help teachers not incentivize students only with candy. Using power hour incentives as gift cards this year instead of just candy bars. Could still improve our variety of rewards that aren't just junk food. We have support groups provided by counseling center to help with student mental health. On the whole, students seem glad to be back at school. COVID numbers seem to be manageable currently and just keep encouraging students to wear masks and keep up with school throughout the quarantine process.

2:35-2:45pm New Quarantine/ Low Risk Exposure Requirements

State has changed requirements that if they get a negative test they can cut some time off the 14 day quarantine period. Takes certain requirements and can't have symptoms.

2:45-2:46pm Community Items

Concerns for safety during dropoff and pickup times. Keep watching and reminding students to be safe.

2:47- 2:50pm Principal Items

Got several thousand extra due to student count being larger than the estimate. Shouldn't lose too many students when we switch to the middle school model. So we lose $\frac{1}{3}$ of Springville students, but get some from Spanish Fork specifically Diamond Fork. Really just making more space in K-9 for a few years. Growth is still happening in the area.
