In accordance with state standards, Mapleton Junior High School has identified school access routes for Mapleton Junior High School students who live within the walk boundary established for the school. A map showing the identified routes can be viewed on the following page.

The intent of a School Access Route Plan is not to identify every school access route or to identify the more convenient school access routes; it is to identify main walk/bike routes that appear to be secure. Care has been taken to consult with local law enforcement, school PTA and School Community Council representatives, and the District's traffic safety committee in establishing these school access routes. Despite broad consultation and unanimous agreement from all parties involved in establishing these routes, no one, including the Nebo School District and Mapleton Junior High School can guarantee that the agreed upon school access routes are or will ever be completely free from hazards.

Parents are encouraged to walk or bike the school access routes with their child/children, to address specific concerns they may have, and to instruct their child/children to obey the laws and rules pertaining to pedestrian safety. If a parent feels their child/children should use a school access route that is not identified in this plan, it is their prerogative to instruct their child/children as to what they feel is best for them.

As previously stated, the intent of a School Access Route Plan is not to identify every school access route or to identify the more convenient school access routes. For this plan, school access routes leading to the school from areas where clusters of students live, have been identified and are described below.

School Access Route Descriptions:

1. Students that live west of Main Street and North of 1200 N are encouraged to make their way to 2000 N or 1600 N (whichever is closer) and head East until they reach Main Street. When they come upon Main Street they should proceed South on Main Street until they reach 1200 N. They should then use the crosswalk to cross Main Street and proceed East on 1200 N until reaching 200 E. They should then use the crosswalk to cross 1200 N. Then arrive at the school.
2. Students that live on 1200 N, but west of the school should travel east, using the crosswalk on Main Street, continuing east until reaching 200 E. They should use the crosswalk heading south to the school. Those students that live on 1200 N but East of the school should travel West on the side walk that is on the North side of the road and then using the crosswalk that is on the corner of 400 E and 1200 N to make their way to the school.
3. Students that live South of 1200 N, but West of Main Street should make their way to 300 W and then North until reaching 1200 N and then East on 1200 N, using the crosswalk to cross over Main Street, and proceed east on 1200 N until reaching 200 E. They should then use the crosswalk to cross 1200 N. until reaching the school.
4. Students that live on Main Street, should travel along Main Street toward 1200 N. Using the crosswalk at 1200 N, you should then travel East on 1200 N until arriving at the school.

5. Students that live south of 1200 N and East of Main Street should find their way to 400 E. They should then head north on 400 E until reaching 1200 N. Cross 400 E. using the Crosswalk to reach the school safely.
6. Students that live North of 1200 N but South of 1600 N and East of Main Street should travel South to 1200 N and then toward the school using crosswalks to cross the road and arrive safely.
7. Students that live East of Main Street and North of 1600 N should travel South to 1600 N and then East or West until reaching 600 E. Then traveling South on 600 E until reaching 1200 N and then travel West until reaching the crosswalk at the corner of 1200 N and 400 E. Use the crosswalk to arrive at the school.
